They also delay or prevent many diseases that are common in older adults such as diabetes, colon and breast cancers, and heart disease. #### **Nutrition in the New Year**

Studies show the links between a healthy diet and cognitive function. The following foods may boost memory in healthy older adults.

- Regular intake of omega-3 fatty acids, folic acid, vitamins and beta -carotene have been recommended for maintaining memory capacities.
- Consumption of green vegetables, beans, berries, nuts and olive oil may help prevent the development of Alzheimer's disease.
- Consumption of blueberries and strawberries help prevent age-related mental decline (Yakimchuk, MD, PhD, 2018).

**Salt & Snow Removal:** This year there is a shortage of salt due to a salt mine strike that took place earlier in the year. As a result, the government had priority on the purchase of salt, which added to the shortage. Holland Home was able to purchase approximately half of the normal salt used for a winter season. Due to this, unless there are extreme ice conditions, we will only salt the licensed areas. Please note that there may be ice and slippery areas on the sidewalks and parking lots, so please be careful. Holland Home will continue the routine snow plowing and shoveling of parking lots and sidewalks when there are snow accumulations of 1.5 inches or more.
