Health Services Information

Prescription Disposal - The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency issued new rules for healthcare providers on handling hazardous waste pharmaceuticals on February 22, 2019. A provision that prohibits disposing pharmaceuticals down the drain becomes effective nationally on and after August 21, 2019. The rules were enacted to protect drinking water and surface water. They are expected to reduce the amount of hazardous waste pharmaceuticals entering U.S. waterways by as much as 2,300 tons annually. Please check with your pharmacy regarding medication disposal or bring your unwanted medications to the Terrace Health Centre for disposal. They must be in their original containers and be dropped off during business hours. There is a \$3.00 fee for disposal. Please direct questions to Jill at 643-2735.

OPERA IN THE WOODS: We, as a committee, are pleased to announce the 2019-20 season's operas that will play in the Terrace Theatre at 6:30 pm on the following Wednesdays.

September 25: "Aida" - Verdi - The story takes place in ancient Egypt and relates to a war between two countries, Egypt and Ethiopa. The climax, which is spectacular, comes early in the grand "Victory March". The war is background to a love story that ends in tragedy. The complication is the relationship between two women who are both in love with the same man.

November 20: "Eugene Onegin" - Tchaikowsky - The story revolves around a teenage girl who falls in love with an older man, in his early twenties. She is ready to be engaged, but he is not. The love proceeds toward a surprise ending (interrupted only by a duel).

<u>January 22:</u> "Fallstaff" - Verdi - Verdi was intrigued by Shake-speare's plays. The distinctive element of this opera was that Verdi combined parts from two plays, "The Merry Wives of Windsor" and "Henry IV". Terfel gives a memorable performance of an egotistical, dirty, sloppy old man.

March 25: "Thais" - Massenet - This is a beautiful, but stormy, love story; human on one side and religious on the other, between a lively courtesan and a stern hermit. It takes place in Egypt during the early period of Christianity. The opera ends in a heavy surprise.

May 27: "The Flying Dutchman" - Wagner - This story is about a sea captain who swears a violent epitaph against God. He is sentenced to eternal life searching for a woman whose love will release him from his sentence. He finds her, but she also has a young suiter.
