

Did you know Trinity Health Southwest Pharmacy delivers prescription and over-the-counter medications Monday - Friday to the Estates Health Centers? This is open to anyone who could benefit from not having to leave the Raybrook Campus to pick up medications.

The Health Center Staff can help you get started if you stop by with your ID, insurance card, previous pharmacy information and a list of medications. Next you inform your Doctor of the change. You will be able to continue to request refills yourself. Medication cost can vary by Pharmacy, so you may want to check ahead of time on the costs of your specific medications. There is no delivery fee, and you can be a patient of any health system to utilize this service.
